





Resource Tables and Activities

allcove

allcove is a space for youth to find community, support, advice or even just a moment of pause. The centers offer spaces for youth to access a range of emotional, physical, and social support services - on their own terms.

Behavioral Health Services Department: Q Corner, Substance Use Prevention

The Q Corner provides peer support, resource linkage, and mental health services. The mission of Substance Use Prevention is to provide resources to improve access to treatment for substance use disorders and prevention.

Board of Supervisor District 1 - Sylvia Arenas

The mission of Supervisor Arenas is to provide total representation - ensuring D1 constituents, neighborhoods and communities have a voice on the Board of Supervisors.

CalWORKs Employment Services - Intern & Earn Program

The Intern & Earn Program is aimed toward young adults and provides internship opportunities at County worksites, non-profits, and private organizations.

Downtown Youth Wellness Center (DYWC)

The DYWC is a County of Santa Clara Behavioral Health program dedicated to promoting a safe, supportive, and youth-focused environment for young people ages 12 to 25.

Fresh Lifelines for Youth (FLY)

Public Health Department: Capitanes del Bosque (Captains of the Forrest), Tobacco-Free Communities Program

The Capitanes del Bosque mission is to develop youth leadership by encouraging nature exploration within our local parks and open spaces, while fostering relationships with park staff. The Tobacco-Free Communities program strives to improve the health of all residents and the workforce in Santa Clara County by reducing illness and premature death attributed to the use of tobacco products.

Registrar of Voters (ROV)

The ROV protects and ensures the community's right to participate in fair, inclusive, accurate, and transparent elections.

San Jose Youth Commission

The Youth Commission promotes resources and opportunities available to youth and provides equitable access and support to marginalized youth communities.

Services are available for all ages and in other languages unless noted.

Crisis & Suicide Prevention Lifeline

Call or text **988** (for local area codes)

All others call 800-704-0900 & press 1

Free, 24/7 support for anyone experiencing mental health distress, including:

- thoughts of suicide
- mental health or substance use crisis
- just need to talk

Trained counselors will provide compassionate support to individuals in crisis. Speak to a clinician who can screen and assess crisis situations over the phone and intervene wherever the crisis is occurring. The lifeline is anonymous and confidential: information will not be shared unless in-person services are needed. Services may or may not involve law enforcement in emergencies.

Free, 24/7 access to County services, including:

- specialty mental health
- substance use treatment or prevention
- support for survivors of suicide
- general information, grievances, and appeals

Trained and licensed mental health and substance use treatment services professionals will provide support. Referrals for Assisted Outpatient Treatment are also available.

In emergency situations, ask for a C.I.T. officer trained in mental health issues.
